Course Info:

The six hour course is designed to equip animal responders with the basic knowledge and safety skills required to integrate with firefighters within the urban interface of Wildland Fire. The curriculum also provides seasoned firefighters insights into animal rescue during fire events. Instruction includes relevant studies from S-190 Introduction to Wildland Fire Behavior and S-130 Firefighter Training.

The course is intended for fire, rescue, law enforcement personnel, animal control officers, livestock professionals, veterinary professionals and others who may be called upon to assist during Wildland Fire incidents.

Upon successfully completing the curriculum with a cumulative average score of 80% of above, students will receive a certificate of completion and be eligible to apply for continuing education credits (CEUs) from Colorado State University. Veterinary professionals can also apply for CEUs from Colorado State University Teaching Hospital.

We encourage eligible individuals to take advantage of this opportunity to expand their knowledge and skills in animal rescue and safety during Wildland Fire incidents. The training comprises animal emergency management issues focusing on the urban interface during wildland fire events.
